You will have Splash Learn, Readworks, and Khan Academy assignments that are due weekly. So please be logging into these each week to complete the assignments. I hope you are all doing great and I miss seeing you every day in the classroom. I will be sending out your passwords to each online site to Remind. ## Week 1: April 6 – April 9

- Journal. Write a paragraph about how things have changed since I last seen you. You can write about your feelings, what you've been doing, and if you like this "new" school or not.
- Go on a walk and see if you can find a fossil.
- Read a book of your choice and tell someone about it (characters, plot, setting, summary).
- Practice your multiplication facts in a creative way. Example: make flash cards, make up songs, create dance moves.

- Journal. Write a paragraph about an adventure you have been on. Remember to give details. You need a topic sentence, at least 3 details, and a closing sentence.
- Read a book. Tell someone what your book is about. Give Details.
- Draw a detailed map of your house. Remember how we drew the map of the school, now draw one of your house.
- Do a fraction hunt. Find objects or sets of objects in your house that are partitioned into halves, thirds, fourths, and eighths.

### Week 3: April 20 – April 23

- Journal. What is your favorite movie? Write a paragraph to tell why it's the best movie. Give at least 3 reasons why it's the best movie.
- Find 3 things to read in your house. It can be anything (cereal box, shampoo bottle, etc.) Read all three and discuss with someone how each item you read was different.
- Take a nature walk with an adult and identify 3 living things. How is each able to survive in their environment?
- Create a picture only using circles and triangles. Must use only 5 of each shape. Be sure to title your art.
- Use a map to plan your dream vacation. Where would you go? What would you see?

## Week 4: April 27 – April 30

- Istation Math
- Readworks (Social Studies and Science)
- Splash Learn (Math)
- Khan Academy (Math and Grammar)
- Journal. Families are important because... Explain.
- Build a habitat from materials at home. Keep in mind what animal you are building for and what that animal needs to survive.
- Read a book, write two facts and two opinions about the book you are reading
- Create a math game practicing a skill you've learned this year using materials around your house. (Examples: find equal groups of three and multiply them.)
- Help a family member to make dinner. Be sure to carefully read all the directions.

## Week 5: May 4 – May 7

- Readworks (Social Studies and Science)
- Splash Learn (Math)

- Journal. What is the most important thing you would tell someone about school closing? Are you happy or sad?
- Plant some seeds in a cup. Remember the life cycles of a plant? Draw pictures of what your plant looks like week to week.
- Read a book of your choice and list 3 causes and effects from the text.
- Practice area and perimeter by making shapes with Cheez-It Crackers. How many crackers go around the outside (Perimeter)? How many crackers make up the inside of your shape (Area)?
- Do some research on the weather in your area for the next week. Record yourself giving a detailed weather report.

## Week 6: May 11 – May 14

- Readworks (Social Studies and Science)

- Journal. Finish this sentence in five different ways: What if...
- Write a journal entry to someone who doesn't live in New Mexico and describe what they would experience. What would they see, what is the weather like? Draw pictures to help explain New Mexico.
- Read a book, Would the main character in your book make a good friend? Why?
- Grab a bag of colored candy such as skittles or M&M's. Make a graph of the number of candies in each color in the bag. Write some questions about the information for your family to answer.
- Record yourself teaching someone how to do something. For example, make a peanut butter and jelly sandwich, braid your hair, paint a picture, etc.
